In July I traveled to Rainy Lake, Minnesota, with a fellow fisherman from our sending church. Together we attended another church's annual fishing extravaganza. Since that time, Pat has continued to help me expand my fishing skills in our scant spare time.

In September our family was able to spend a week at a ranch in northern Illinois. The ranch belongs to members of a supporting church. While staying at this ranch, we learned how to ride horses; I learned how to throw a rope over a practice steer, and the owner showed me a little about shoeing.

In August we participated in the VBT for Prior Lake Baptist Church. We had fun with the western theme by dressing up in traditional Uruguayan clothes. Several children were asked what they wanted to be when they grew up. Some said, "A missionary!"

In September we attended Farmtastic, an annual youth rally in Rochelle, Illinois. This year about 800 teens and helpers attended. Around 30 teens made professions of salvation, and several others dedicated their lives to full-time service. Praise the Lord for the opportunity to speak with two of them. I am still in contact with one of the teens.
