In addition, nothing was seriously broken in our container. A BIG thank you goes to all the churches that participated in the initial loading, and to the believers who helped us unload in Uruguay.

Montevideo has several established ministries. We have visited three in the past three months, and during this time of language training we will visit several more. Our desire is to observe as many national ministries as possible. We hope to understand why Uruguayans do what they do at church, as long as these things are biblical, we will use them. We have no desire to import foreign issues or American church culture.
